

The Day of Aashura

The 10th of Muharram is known as the day of Aashura. When Rasulullah ﷺ came to Madinah, he found the Jews fasting on Aashura. Rasulullah ﷺ enquired as to the reason for fasting to which they replied, “This is a blessed day. On this day, Allah saved Moosa عليه السلام and drowned the followers of Fir’aun. Moosa عليه السلام thereafter fasted on this day in gratitude to Allah.” Rasulullah ﷺ said, “I am closer to Moosa عليه السلام than you.” He ﷺ then fasted on that day and commanded the Muslims to fast as well. (Bukhari)

Rasulullah ﷺ in another Hadith stated,

“The fast of Aashura wipes out the sins of a year.” (Muslim)

Rasulullah ﷺ further advised keeping an additional fast a day before or after the 10th as the Jews fasted on the 10th only. It is necessary that Muslims be distinct and apart from the practice of non-Muslims.

**Aashura Fast: 9, 10 Muharram = 11, 12 Oct. (Tue/Wed)
or 10, 11 Muharram = 12, 13 Oct. (Wed/Thu)**

Additionally, the day of Aashura is an excellent opportunity to spend on one's family. Rasulullah ﷺ has stated,

**“Whoever is generous to his family on the Day of Aashura,
Allah will be generous to him for the rest of the year.”** (Targheeb)
